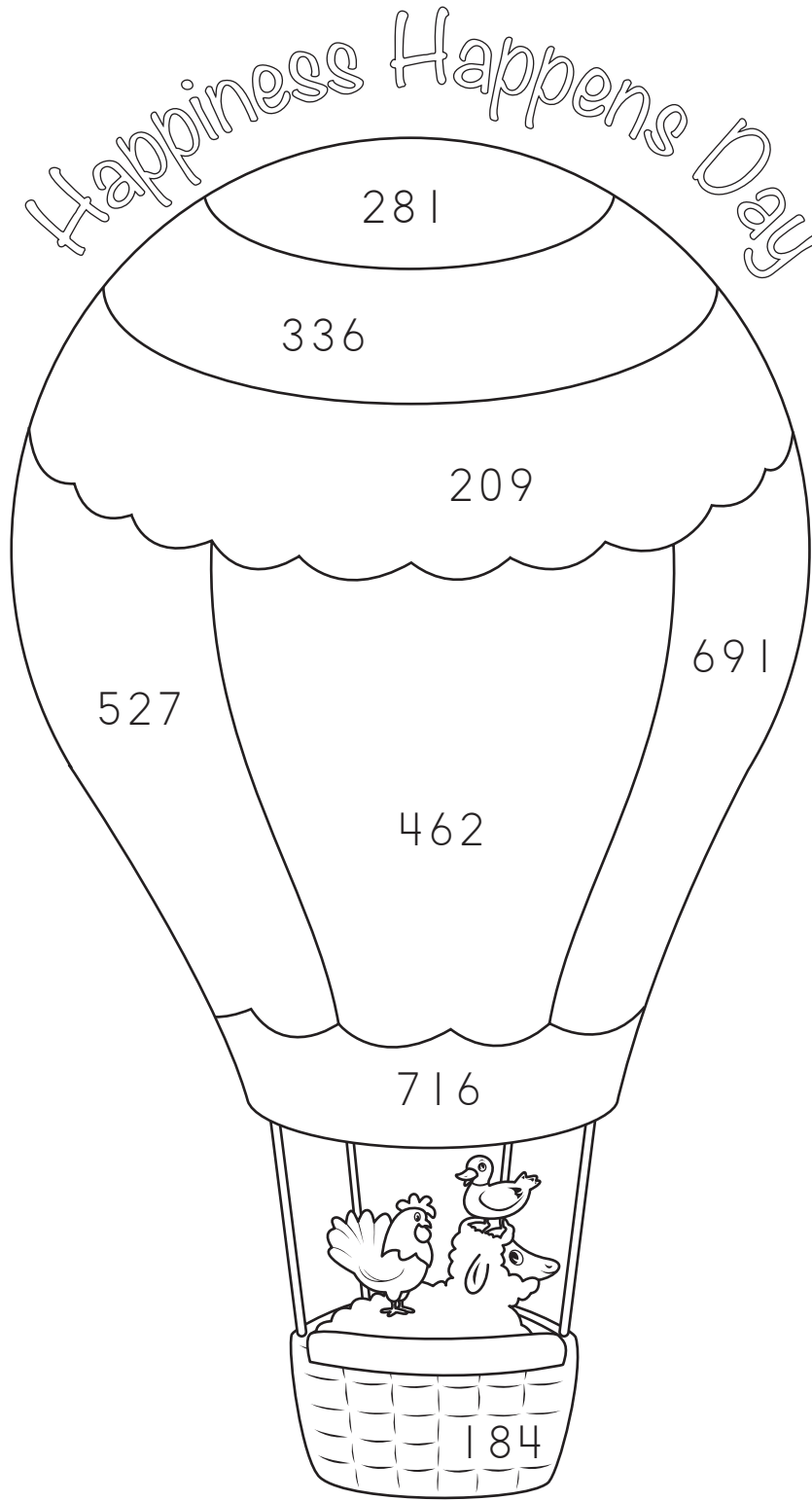
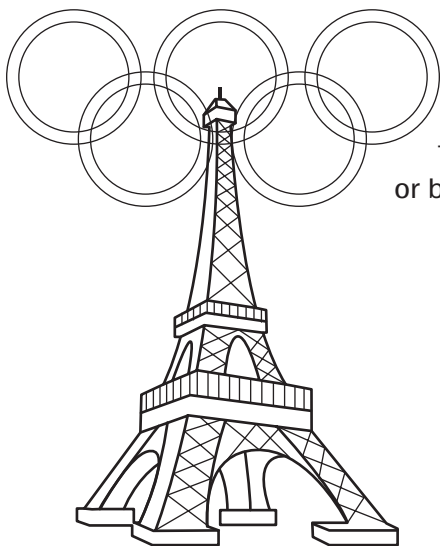

Did you know?

The Statue of Liberty was made in France and shipped to the United States. It was a gift from the people of France. Help the ship with the Statue cross the Atlantic Ocean to New York. Count back from 514 as you go through the maze.

The maze starts with a ship carrying the Statue of Liberty on the left and ends with a map of the U.S.A. on the right. The path through the maze is defined by numbers that decrease by 1 as you move from left to right. The starting number is 514, and the ending number is 483.
